RECIPE FOR CHEESE AND ONION QUICHE

INGREDIENTS:

For the pastry:

250g plain flour 125g cold unsalted butter, cubed half teaspoon salt 1 large egg 2-3 tbspns ice-cold water



For the filling: 200ml double cream 100ml whole milk 4 large eggs 100g cheddar or gruyere (or a mix) - grated 100g caramelised onions from a jar (or caramelised onion chutney) 1 tbspn Dijon mustard

METHOD:


1. Heat the oven to 180 degrees C (fan) or 200 degrees (conventional).

For the pastry, put the flour, salt and butter in a food processor, then pulse to a breadcrumb consistency. In a small bowl, beat the egg with 2 tbspns of the water. Add to the flour and whizz briefly to bring the pastry together, adding the remaining water if needed. (If you don't have a food processor, rub the butter into the flour/salt with your fingers, then add the egg/water mixture and mix with a knife). Turn out onto a floured work surface, then bring together in a ball. Roll out the pastry to a 30cm disk and use to line the tart tin. Leave a little pastry overhang (don't trim), then chill for 30 minutes.

2. Prick the chilled pastry base all over with a fork, then line with a piece of baking paper. Fill with baking beans or uncooked rice, then blind bake for 20 minutes. Remove the paper and beans/rice and bake for 8-10 minutes more until golden. Remove from the oven, set on a baking tray and trim the pastry overhang with a serrated knife.

Turn down the oven to 150 degrees C (fan) or 170 degrees (conventional).

3. For the filling, whisk the cream, milk and eggs together in a large bowl. Add the grated cheese, caramelised onions and mustard with a pinch of salt, then stir to combine. Pour the filling into the hot tart shell then return, on the baking tray, to the oven for 45 minutes or until set with a slight wobble in the centre. Cool, then serve.

We would also like to thank everyone who attends, helps and takes part in the Aldbrough Feast, as without you the Feast would not continue and that would be a shame, particularly as it has been running since 1281.

The History of Aldbrough Feast

In 1281, Edward I granted John of Brittany, Earl of Richmond, the right to hold a weekly market and an annual fair on the Feast of St Michael (Michaelmas Day, 29th September) at Aldbrough. This was the start of the Feast.

Over the years, because of the harvest, the date was brought forward to the 2nd Monday in August. The Feast has had its ups and downs over the years. In the late 1800s, it became known as a week's booze-up, and in the early 1930s it nearly closed from lack of funds but the village blacksmith, Mr Joe Robinson, who was secretary of the Feast, managed to keep it going. He was secretary from 1919 to the 1950s when he retired. He was so successful that in 1939 there were over 6,000 spectators. There was pony racing and showjumping on the Monday and no doubt there was some illegal gambling, as busloads of miners used to come from South West Durham.

In the 1970s it nearly closed again when one person had to erect the arena on his own. At the threatened closing down meeting the village rallied round and it has gone from strength to strength ever since.

Use of Feast Money Raised

The money raised during the Feast is for the benefit of the village. We will be giving 10% of the annual Feast surplus to local charity, this year the chosen charity is St Teresa's Hospice. If people want to nominate a charity for next year, they should send details to Kirstie Thornton <u>Kirstie.thornton@googlemail.com</u>. If you have a suggestion on the use of funds do mention it to a member of the committee or email it to the Secretary.
